Did you know, that...

- exchange rates may differ in individual exchange offices
- every exchange office must give you a printed receipt confirmation of a transaction
- exchange offices **are not allowed to charge a commission** for changing currencies
- on the list of exchange rates, you will always find the price of buying the foreign currency from the client first, and the price of selling the currency follows

If you suspect that the transaction was not conducted properly and fairly, you may withdraw from the contract and get your money back within 3 hours (if the transaction wasn't higher than $1000 \in$).
